AMECO EXTRA CLASS CODE COURSE CATALOG NO. 104-33

The Extra Class Code Course is designed to prepare an amateur operator for the Extra Class code examination. The Extra Class code examination consists of sending and receiving English words, numbers and punctuation marks at the rate of 20 words per minute.

The course is divided into ten lessons - the first lesson is 13 words per minute and the last lesson is 22 words per minute. In order to insure passing a 20 word per minute test, the prospective operator should be able to receive at least 22 words per minute. The reason for this is because the student is generally nervous when taking the examination and needs this extra two-minute "cushion".

This course assumes that the amateur operator can receive at least 13 words per minute. If not, one or more of the other Ameco code courses should be used to bring the speed of the operator up to 13 words per minute. The other Ameco courses are listed at the end of these instructions. If the student has not used code recently, it is suggested that the enclosed 32-page code course booklet be read over completely for review. In fact, even if the operator has had recent code experience, a reading of the first three chapters of the book would be helpful in increasing one's speed. For additional concentrated practice for the Extra Class code examination, the Extra Class Supplementary Code Course (Catalog #106-33) is recommended.

It is important to practice sending as well as receiving. As the receiving speed improves, the student should improve his sending speed. The sending should be accurate and "clean". Bear in mind that the FCC examiner will test the student in sending, as well as in receiving.

The following material is contained in the Extra Class Code Record. Use a 33-1/3 RPM record player and a good quality stylus that will not wear the record excessively.

LESSON 1 - 13 W.P.M.

Lesson 1 consists of parts of English words, punctuation marks and numbers. Parts of words are more difficult to memorize than words, but they give similar practice.

LESSON 2 - 14 W.P.M.

Lesson 2 consists mainly of five-letter code groups. They are not parts of words and because of this, the speed of the lesson appears to be more than one word per minute faster than Lesson 1. It is difficult to memorize code groups. Make sure that you can copy at this speed before going on to the next lesson.
