Dear Student,

Our BEGINNERS' MORSE COURSE has been so popular that we have been requested to make a similar record for more advanced students.

The ADVANCED MORSE COURSE is similar to the Beginners' Course in that it is a three-speed record, playing with a L.P. (Microgroove) replay stylus. The course consists of 12 lessons, each getting a little faster. Unlike the Beginners' Course, which has letters with long spaces, this Course concentrates on correct spacing as used by commercial operators.

It is assumed that the student has a fair knowledge of Morse and therefore record space is not wasted with teaching the code but includes plain language, numbers, code groups and punctuation.

This Course has been designed to help you to improve your Morse, both sending and receiving, because when you are used to receiving perfect Morse you cannot send bad Morse accidentally.

The Course is split up into 12 lessons and when played at 33, which will take you from just over 7 w.p.m. to 18 w.p.m. By playing back at 45 and 78 you increase the speeds proportionately to a maximum speed of 42 w.p.m.

Remember that as this record has the total playing time extended to 86 minutes it is advantageous, but not essential, to disconnect the auto stop on automatic changers.

I feel sure that you will find this record invaluable for improving your Morse and it can be used as a standard against which you can test yourself and your friends.

The speeds given for the various lessons apply when the record is being played at 33 $\frac{1}{3}$. For 45 r.p.m. x by 45/33.3 and for 78 r.p.m. x by 78/33.3. Remember always use a microgroove replay stylus and if possible remove auto stop.

is almost impossible to read, so WATCH YOUR SPACING.

The G3HSC 7" morse check record correction sheet

This check record is designed as part of the Beginners Course and is not a TRAINING record, nor should it be used as such. It simulates a G.P.O. test, being the same length, number of words etc. but jumbled up to prevent you from learning them too easily. (The actual G.P.O. test is as set out in the Beginners Instruction Book and is of course only in plain language.)

The Morse on this record is in STRICT TEMPO and is recorded with a soft type of keying, whereas on the instruction records hard key-ing is used so that you will have experience of both types.

Whereas those who have learnt by the RHYTHM BEGINNERS COURSE will not require the following check sheet as they will know instinctively if they make a mistake, it is reproduced for those who have not yet obtained the RHYTHM COURSE.
